Poets are invited to submit a 30 line or less poem about Tennessee Williams as a screenwriter or about the film *A Street Car Named Desire*, written for the screen by Tennessee Williams. The film is being shown at the Tropic Cinema on March 6 at 6 p.m. The completed registration form below, a registration fee of \$20 for adults and \$10 for students and the completed poem must be postmarked no later than March 8 and sent to the address on the form. Nance Boylan, Key West Poetry Guild, will coordinate the Poetry Contest and join three local respected poets in serving as judges. They will be given copies of the poems without names of the contestants. The first place winner will be awarded \$200 and the second place winner \$100. The winners will be honored and asked to read their poems at the March 26 Birthday Reception from 6 to 8 p.m. at the Tennessee Williams Exhibit, 513 Truman Avenue. **Last year's winning poems were published in an on-line journal.** **SPECIAL NOTE:** Members of the Key West Poetry Guild will celebrate the poetry of Tennessee Williams with readings from his work on March 1 at 6 p.m. at the Key West Public Library, 700 Fleming St.
